Approval of Minutes

The minutes of the Board of Directors Meeting on March 24, 2015 were presented and reviewed. Al Bulgawicz moved to accept the minutes of the Board of Directors Meeting held on March 24, 2015 as written. Bob Kane seconded the motion.

Treasurers Report/Finance Committee Report Treasurer Frank Lupton

Treasures Report ~ Frank Lupton reported that there have not been any major differences to the approved 2015 budget, most areas are as projected. Miniature Horse World Magazine is continuing to hold its own. As projected, membership and registration has declined.

Finance Committee ~

- 1) The LOC Budget was discussed noting a \$601 increase in LOC expenses. Bob Kane moved to approve the 2015 LOC Budget with the correction of \$601 additional expenses. Clair Severson seconded.

 Unanimously passed
- 2) Director Compensation was discussed. The finance committee has requested that directors who are able, consider paying their own travel and hotel expenses instead of submitting receipts to AMHA for reimbursement.
- 3) During the Annual Membership Meeting there is typically a Continental Breakfast available for those in attendance. This is an expense of \$4500. There was a question about the necessity of this service and also the break snacks provided during meetings.

Bob Kane moved that AMHA provide Coffee, Tea and Water (no food items) during the 2016 Annual Membership Meeting. Seconded by Clair Severson Unanimously Approved

Note: In 2016 the required amount that AMHA needs to spend on food items through the conference center is \$6000, there should be no problem satisfying this requirement with the Awards Banquet.

4) Budget for the 2016 Annual Meeting ~ Frank Lupton moved to approve the proposed budget for the 2016 Annual Membership Meeting as amended. Al Bulgawicz seconded the motion.

#1520 – The committee recommended this for a vote by the membership, If this fails, all other related bylaw proposals and Rules & Regs proposals also fail.

#1521 – The committee recommended this proposal to be voted on by the membership.

#1522 – The committee does not recommend, after much discussion. We questioned how you would ever pass a rule change if it required a majority vote of all Regular Members in good standing considering the total number of AMHA members. We also Considered the time and expense of mailing all proposals to every member. We also discussed the need for members unable to attend to utilize their elected director to share their concerns.

#1532 – The majority of the committee agreed that we had no recommendation, although Harry Elder did not agree with passing this proposal.

Allison Rosauer questioned item 1532 and the age of the horse when examined. There was a discussion about whether the age of a horse should be 3 years old

or 5 years old at the time it is examined for hardship if approved. The board discussed the importance of consistency throughout the rulebook. This may require a rule change.

Susan Arnold will contact Joanne Anderson (author of the proposed Bylaw 1532) to see if she agrees with the changes proposed.

#1533 - was received and will be brought forward to the membership. Submitted by the Bylaws Committee as originated by Harry Elder to clear up a conflict regarding the Executive Committee members.

Rules and Regulations (attached)

Bill Arnold

The Rules and Regs items are all contingent to whether the submitted Bylaw #1520 is passed and approved.

The Rules and Regs Committee recommends that all of the proposed changes go forward.

The BOD voted unanimously to move items #1540 through #1544 forward as recommended by the Rules and Regs Committee.

Item #1545 was discussed and there were several concerns. Some of those concerns were the proposed measuring requirements ~ the board discussed having these requirements more structured and seen by more than just one certified measurer, also, the age of the horse being measured and inspected needs to be consistent throughout AMHA rules and regs. There were also concerns that nothing in this proposal mentioned DNA typing.

The board could vote on this item as presented or amend it and then vote on the amended version. It was decided to make amendments and discuss these changes with the author of the proposal for her approval.

Board amendments for Item #1545

- Darlene Bridges moved that the board amend Item #1545 to state that the horse must reach 60 months of age prior to hardship measuring. Seconded by Gene Baynham. Passed unanimously by the BOD
- 2) Gary Owen moved to amend Item #1545 193 C (Measuring) # 2 and #6 to state that the horse will be measured by a present or former AMHA Board of Director Member who holds a current measuring card and witnessed by an AMHA judge. Seconded by Laurie Slobody. Passed unanimously by the BOD

- 3) Allison Rosauer Moved that 193 B (Application) #5 be eliminated due to the fact that ownership of farm prefix may cause issues with this item. Julianna Myers 2nd. Passed unanimously by the BOD
- 4) Gary Owen moved to change the wording in 193 A (Qualifications) keeping items 1, 2 and 3 as stated and add "the owner must" prior to items #4, 5 and 6. Seconded by Joe Kahre. Unanimously passed by the BOD
- 5) 193 D (Inspection), Bob Kane moved to add a requirement that hair will be pulled from the horse that is undergoing hardship inspection by the person inspecting and measuring the horse. The hair sample will be sent to the lab by the person inspecting the horse and 4 photos should be taken by the person inspecting the horse to insure that the horse brought for the inspection is the same horse applied for. Julianna Seconded. Passed unanimously by the BOD.

Allison Rosauer requested that information regarding upcoming hardship inspections be posted on the AMHA website stating the horse's name and location of hardship inspection.

Clair Severson moved that Item #1545 be approved with the 5 amendments stated above. Gary Owen seconded. Unanimously passed with the 5 amendments.

SHOW RULES (attached)

Bob Kane

Items # 1501 and 1502 were pulled by Mary Lou Elder and then brought back to the Show Rules Committee ~ these items failed to be approved by the Show Rules Committee because horses over 34" have not been approved to show in AMHA recognized shows.

Items # 1506 and 1507 ~ The Youth Committee withdrew these items and they will continue to work on them and submit in 2016

Item # 1508 was referred to the AMHA Office for an impact statement during the May 5th Show Rules Meeting. A response was sent by the office to Show Rules and the committee voted to move it forward in their May 26th meeting. PASSED by BOD.

Item # 1509 ~Stated that driving horses that reverse at the walk are required to turn to the left when changing direction. Those classes that do not change direction at the walk ~ but at the trot... will continue to follow the ring steward's instruction.

Item # 1516 \sim this item will only impact Amateur Grand Driving Classes, not Youth

Standing Rule 6-18-12 ~ Bob Kane asked to have the Show Rules Committee look into this Standing Rule.

Bob Kane suggested that the AMHA Board of Directors receive one reimbursement for the June BOD meeting and that the meeting will be held in a conference center/hotel instead of by teleconference. No action was taken.

Laurie Slobody mentioned that the Rule that she submitted for consideration regarding using dye or paint to blacken lower legs of show horses is not currently listed for discussion at the 2016 Annual Meeting. Randy Peacock will look into this and report back to the board the status of this item.

AMHA ANNUAL MEETING FEES

COMMITTEE REPORTS (attached)

President's Report ~ President Sid Hutchcraft gave a favorable report for the first half of 2015. There have, and will continue to be challenges, but the AMHA Committees, Directors, and Office Staff are all working together to make the best decisions for AMHA. He also expressed appreciation to the staff for their good work.

Al Bulgawicz ~ There is no HUB Committee Report. Though there were quite a few Committee Reports submitted, there were also several key Committees that did not report.

Clair Severson gave a verbal report on the Promotions Committee, Long Range Planning and there was also a verbal report on what the Performance Committee is working on.

The board felt that it would be helpful, during future teleconference board meetings, for committee chairs to be included on the call so that they are able to answer questions from the board.

The Staff Report was included in the board information packets ~ there was no discussion but a recommendation was made by Hutchcraft for the BOD to review each of these reports.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

FUNDRAISING EFFORTS

- 1) Joe Kahre has been in contact with someone from Purina. Their budget has been set for 2015, so Joe is working on a proposal to partner with Purina for 2016. There has been some discussion about having a booth set up at the Eastern Regional Show and distributing vouchers or coupons for Purina Feed.
- Randy Purdue has been working with the EC and would like to develop a Power Point Presentation to show prospective corporate sponsors

- highlights of AMHA. He submitted a rough draft Power Point and this will be refined and some information corrected, as we get prepared to meet with prospective sponsors.
- 3) Lisa Hawkins has been given the task of contacting former members in the US. She will be contacting anyone who has allowed their membership to expire from 3 months to 3 years ago. Randy Peacock is working with a staff member to contact former Canadian and International members who have allowed their memberships expire.
- 4) Corporate Sponsorships ~ the BOD discussed how we can generate more interest in corporate sponsorships. It may be beneficial to hire a professional or someone with good communication skills on a commission basis for this task.

Frank Lupton felt the finance committee should work on coming up with survey questions for the membership to gather necessary data to show prospective commercial sponsors how valuable our membership is and what our buying power is. He will work with Joe Kahre as well. Directors were asked to also think of questions that could be helpful for this survey.

NEW BUSINESS

1) 2017 Annual AMHA Membership Meeting ~ Regis Hartnett contacted South Point in Las Vegas and directed them to contact Sid Hutchcraft. They have given Sid a very fair proposal. The available dates are one week later than our usual meeting dates.

Harry Elder moved to accept the proposal from South Point in Las Vegas, Nevada for the 2017 AMHA Annual Membership Meeting. Julianna Myers seconded.

The BOD unanimously approved.

Sid will have South Point prepare a contract.

2) World Show Location ~ The BOD discussed some of the pros and cons of changing the location of the AMHA World Championship Show. Sid Hutchcraft will be in Tulsa for a show during the next few weeks and will visit with the folks at Tulsa about the possibilities at that facility.

As of 2017, there may be a need to move the dates and/or location of the World Show since Will Rogers Equestrian Center has given our current dates to another organization. The EC will be monitoring and discussing this new World Show problem.

Al Bulgawicz moved to adjourn the meeting, Laurie Slobody seconded the motion.

(see Rules & Regulations #184 I).

Article XI Sec. 6 Breed Name and Size page 29 #1521 Submitted by: Mary Lou Elder

Horses registered by The American Miniature Horse Association, Inc., shall be a breed of horses known as the American Miniature Horse. Only those horses born in North America or proven to be North America and meeting all AMHA registration criteria shall be granted a registration certificate. The American Miniature Horse shall not exceed thirty-four (34) inches in height when measured according to Article XI, Sec. 4 of these Bylaws to show at a sanctioned show. The registration of any horse exceeding thirty-four (34) inches shall be void and such horse shall not be considered or designated as an American Miniature Horse. Horses exceeding thirty-four (34) inches and not over thirty-eight (38) inches can apply for a Foundation/Oversized certificate of registration (See Rules & Regulations # 1841). All new certificates issued by The American Miniature Horse Association,

Inc. shall bear a prominent legend reflecting the content of this Bylaw. Foundation stock registered pursuant to General Rule 184I shall be exempt from this Bylaw.

- 1. Measure 34" or under in height at the current measuring location according to AMHA Show Rules for Height Verification; (Currently Show Rules GR-020- Height Verification)
- 2. Be three (3) years 60 months of age or greater by its actual date of birth prior to hardship measuring.
- 3. Currently be registered with the American Miniature Horse Registry as "Permanent" status with a recorded height of 34" or under.

The owner must:

- 1. Be a current AMHA member in good standing.
- 2 Provide the completed Hardship Application form.
- 3 Submit and pay the appropriate Fee for Hardship Registration and any other applicable fees.
- 4 Submit with the application, an AMHA approved DNA test results (with the exception of geldings).

193B Application

- 1. Complete the AMHA Hardship Application Form.
- 2. Applicant must be the owner of record of the horse.
- 3. Hardship Application Form must be signed by the owner of record of the horse.
- 4. Submit with the AMHA Hardship Application Form four (4) current unaltered color photographs taken per the guidelines set forth in the most current AMHA rulebook for natural registration.
- 5. Applicant must register the horse with the same name registered to the American Miniature Horse Registry (AMHR).
- 6. Hardship Measurement Card and Hardship Inspection Report shall be submitted directly to the AMHA Home Office, Registration Department, after completion and signed by the appropriate persons.
- 7. Include a copy of the horse's AMHR Permanent Registration Certificate together with the Hardship Application Form.

193C Measuring

Measurement for Hardship Application must be performed at a designated time as set forth by the appropriate Show Representative with advance notification by the applicant for such type measurement, to the respective Show Manager. - 2. Measuring shall be done by the show's official measurer OR a current or former AMHA Director qualified for measuring who holds a current measuring card or a current AMHA steward and witnessed by the show's designated measuring witness an AMHA judge.
- 3. A definite set time for hardship measurement shall be specified in the show premium.
- 4. Measurement shall be performed on the body location of the horse in accordance set forth in the current AMHA Rulebook by the official show measurer and witnessed by a designated measuring observer/witness. (Reference: GR 020 B-C)
- 5. Measurement of horse applying for hardship must take place in direct view of the measuring witness and the owner or duly assigned agent of the animal. Anyone may guest observe the measurement.
- 6. The official show measurer current or former AMHA director or current AMHA steward conducting the measurement, Measuring observer/witness the observing AMHA judge and the owner or duly assigned agent of the animal all must sign the Hardship Measurement Card to be valid.

193D Inspection

- 1. Inspection shall be performed by any AMHA carded Judge. Inspections shall be pre-arranged by the applicant with show management.
- 2. Inspector shall inspect the horse, noting in his/her report major conformation faults, if any, using the AMHA Standard of Perfection as guide and any other items that could disqualify a horse from an AMHA-approved show.
- 3. <u>Inspector is required to personally pull hair from the horse being</u> measured and inspected and send the sample directly to the lab.
- 4. <u>Inspector will take four (4) photos of the horse being inspected to insure</u> that the horse being inspected matches the application photos.

Any Horse, its Owner or duly assigned Agent involved in the hardshipping process that is found by conclusive evidence to not be at arm's length, shall be subject to examination and disciplined by the Executive Committee for assessment and potential cancellation of hardship registration certification.
- 4. Duly assigned Agent shall be defined as: An agent assigned in writing by the owner to have authorization to present the horse for measurement and inspection for the hardship process. A copy of authorization shall accompany the Hardship Application form.
- 5. Any stated reference within this Rule Change as to a location in the AMHA current Rulebook, shall be considered housekeeping to change respectively when necessary for clarification, and does not require a complete rule change process.

Standards of Conformation and Movement

GENERAL IMPRESSION – An attractive horse where everything is proportionate and all parts tie in smoothly. All gaits are smooth and purposeful exhibiting natural athleticism. Horses are judged on balance, structural correctness and sex characteristics. Of these, balance is the most important.

S TA N C E - The American Miniature Horse Association's Stock Type Horse normally stands at ease with his legs perpendicular to the ground and parallel with each other. The horse should exhibit a balanced stance and stand on the corners of his body, as opposed to being spread too far apart or crowded too close together, or parked out.

H E A D - The head of an AMHA Stock Type Horse reflects inquisitive intelligence. He has a short, broad head that is straight or slightly dished topped by small to medium ears hooked towards the center line at the tips; kind wide-set eyes; large nostrils; small muzzle, and firm mouth. A domed forehead is a fault.

BITE – When viewed from the side, the meeting point of the center incisor teeth should be

equal and even. A deviation of no more than half the width of the tooth's surface is permissible without fault.

N E C K - The head of the AMHA Stock Type Horse joins the neck at a roughly 45-degree angle, with a slender throatlatch allowing him to move easily in any direction while maintaining his balance. The medium to long neck should be slightly arched and blend smoothly into sloping shoulders.

SHOULDERS - The AMHA Stock Type Horse's short strong back is created by deep sloping shoulders tying in well back.

CHEST AND FORELEGS - As demonstrated by the heart girth and relatively wide-set forelegs, the AMHA Stock Type Horse is deep and broad in the chest. Smooth joints and short cannon bones are set on clean fetlocks and medium length pasterns are supported by healthy hooves. The forearm tapers to the knee, whether viewed from the front or back.


 ${\bf B} \ {\bf A} \ {\bf C} \ {\bf K}$ - The short back of the AMHA Stock Type Horse is full and strong across the loins. The barrel is formed by deep, well sprung ribs which extend to the hip joints. The underline, or abdominal area, should rise cleanly to the flank. The point of the croup should be no higher than the top of the withers. The tail is set off a long, rounded croup.

HINDQUARTERS - Viewed from either side or the rear, the hindquarters are broad, deep and adequately muscled through the thigh, stifle and gaskin down to the hock. When viewed from the rear, there is adequate width extending evenly from the top of the thigh to the gaskin. The hocks are wide set, deep and straight.

B ONE S, L E G S AND HO O V E S - Flat, strong bones, smooth joints and proper angulations form a leg that is attractive and functional. The hooves are proportionate to overall conformation

MUSCLING -The AMHA Stock Type Horse should have muscling adequate to function, but is not a heavily muscled breed. Overly heavy muscling is a fault. **MOTION**- Stock Type horses track straight and true. At all times they should appear confident, balanced and athletic, demonstrating a low flat stride with minimal knee and hock action.

Stock Type Illustration



Standards and Style

- 1. Stock Type division horses will be shown in a stock horse manner with the horse standing still, calm and square.
- 2. The handler should stand towards the left side of the horse's center line, more or less facing horse.
- 3. Stock type/western show halters will be the accepted standard. At local shows a nylon halter will suffice. An Arabian type halter is unacceptable and will result in disqualification.
- 4. Leads may have chains, but chains may only go under chin and not over the nose or in the mouth.
- 5. Razoring of heads will be heavily penalized. Clipping is permitted.
- 6. Banding or braiding of manes is prohibited.
- 7. Manes should be natural looking and of moderate length
- 8. Pulled, overcut or undercut manes are acceptable.
- 9. Tails should be off the ground.

Requirements

- 1. A horse may not show in more than one halter division at any show with the exception of color and/or Special Needs classes. Versatility is considered a performance class and this does not apply.
- 2. There will be no instances of halter competition between horses representing Stock Type and the other division such as supreme champion classes.
- 3. Current rules for handler's dress will apply in stock division.

4. Current halter ring pattern will be used for stock division.

2. AOTE of the YEAR

The AOTL committee would like to recognize the dedication and discipline of amateurs who own, train and exhibit their own horses by initiating a new "AOTE of the Year" award. This award is meant to recognize members' accomplishments in and out of the ring and will be announced during the Amateur days at Worlds. *An AOTE member is not required to exhibit horses at Worlds to be considered for this award.

We propose to solicit candidates for "AOTE of the Year" by sending a form (with specific questions) to all AMHA local club presidents, asking to work with their board members to select one nominee from their club (an exhibitor who meets the following criteria...nominees must butte to the high standards of the AOTE program through some (or all) of the following:

promotes the American Miniature Horse supports the association: AMHA encourages/builds camaraderie other competitors exemplifies the spirit of good sportsmanship is a positive role model and respected by others volunteers within the miniature horse community

While there is no obligation for local clubs to nominate a member, by doing so they will help our association recognize some of it's most deserving exhibitors. After selecting a nominee, the local club's executive board will be asked to return the form to the chairman of the AOTE committee (or co-chair) by September 1st.

Who votes for the Amateur of the Year once nominations are received?

Possibly the AOTE committee members, or maybe the BOD? We welcome input after this is proposed award is reviewed by the BOD at the June meeting. If everyone thinks choosing an "AOTE of the Year" is a good idea. Mirage Miniatures (Kim and John Sweatt) will agree to a 5 year sponsorship of the award. Initial thoughts are to honor winners by engraving names on a perpetual trophy (which would be kept in the AMHA office) and to present each year's winner with a keepsake trophy.

3. Rule Proposal to increase Amateur Level 1 points

Our committee discussed the rule change proposed and submitted by the Amateur committee, whereby Amateur Level 1 points will be raised from 50 to 75 points before exhibitors are bumped up to Level 2 status. It's the consensus of the AOTE committee that it's hard to justify an Amateur Level 1 point increase, but we do understand this proposal has passed Show Rules to be discussed and voted on at the 2016 annual meeting, Because we also believe this to be somewhat of a "hot" topic, we are hoping to have an AOTE and Amateur meeting or social at Worlds to get input from as many members/exhibitors as possible by discussing current issues and upcoming proposed rule changes.

the show ring because they don't want to compete against Level 2's. But it's also clear that AMHA has an unbalanced percentage of of it's Amateurs competing in Level 1. Additionally, World qualifying points have recently been reduced (with several classes requiring zero points) and several of our larger performance classes- like halter and driving obstacle, hunter, Jumper and Showmanship - don't even have separate Levels.

Bob Kane mentioned the office could potentially manually track Level 1 points, but some AOTE committee members would currently only support

the Level 1 point increase if World Show points also counted, and to take it a step further, would like them to count x's 3 (like at the three regional championships) and possibly also count for Honor Roll. We know these ideas have been proposed before-and have failed to pass for various reasons (i.e. the Central region having an unfair advantage due to the World Show always being held in TX, and the computer system being too antiquated to handle tabulations).
